Our many marketing approaches will include: Newspaper advertising The Fair will be advertised in the *Indiana Daily Student* newspaper.

## Helpful Hints for Recruiting

It can be stressful to find candidates that fit your camp's needs. In order to make your day go smoothly, here are some helpful hints for you:

- Make notes of students who impressed you in an interview or who stopped by your camp display.
- Accept mini-applications: simply a name, phone number, and why the student wants to work at your camp.
- Take advantage of the tables we have set up in the middle of the room so that you may conduct a

more private, personal interview with the most qualified applicants.

- Feel free to stop by the employer break area to grab a quick snack or drink.

## Helpful Hints for Follow-Up

Once you have found qualified candidates, it is important to follow up with them to ensure their future employment. Here are some tips to make that process easier.

- -Consider the college lifestyle. Be flexible about when you call students; remember that nights and weekend afternoons are often good times. Also consider that they are away from campus for Spring Break (March 14-23).
- -Today's student is technologically savvy. Using web and email communication is often best when corresponding with students after the Fair.
