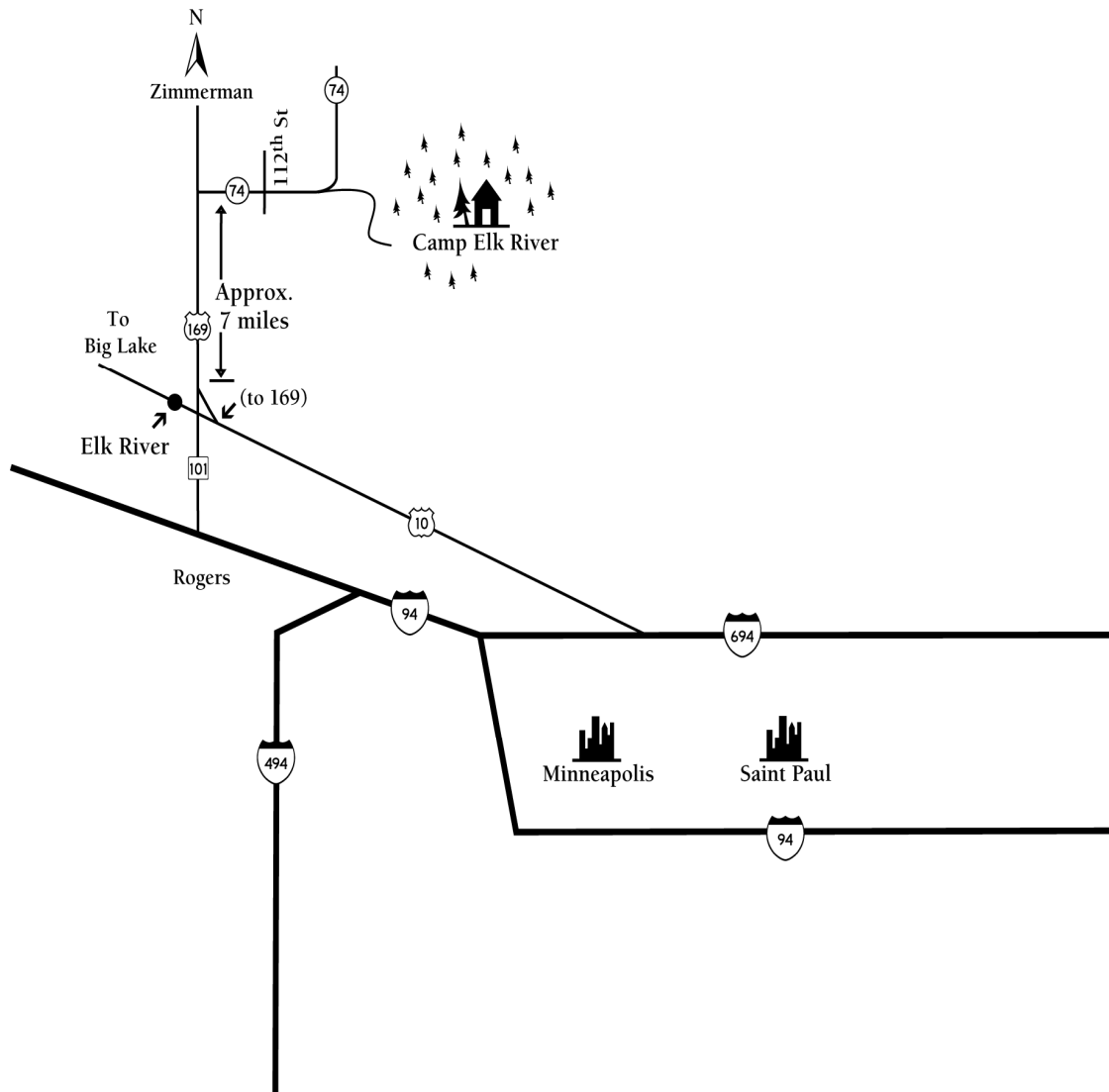

Travel west on I-94 to Rogers, exit Highway 101. Go north on 101 to Elk River, where 101 forms US 169. Continue north on US 169 to Sherburne County Road 74. Turn right on County Road 74 (237th Avenue) and go about 1 mile to gravel road. (County Road 74 continues onto the left.) Continue on the gravel road past the site manager's home on the right. The road will curve to the right. Then turn right at the Lake Barbara sign. Continue straight ahead to the Gray Koch Program building. The parking lot is on the right.

Standard Related News from National

In order to better support the 20/20 Vision and bring our policies in line with what is often practiced, at their October meeting the National Board accepted the recommendation of the National Standards Commission and re-moved the paragraph on page 12 of the Accreditation Process Guide that reads:

Have an operating season with at least one session that is at least five consecutive days in length if a resident camp; or, if a day camp, at least five consecutive days in length or five days in not more than 14 days. The day or resident camp session may be operated by a site owner or by a group using another site's facilities and services.

We have recently been informed that the website which is **REQUIRED to be checked in Standard HR-4A** (National Sex Offender Public Registry) has both changed its name and web address. The NEW name is: Dju Sjodin National Sex Offender Public Web Site, the NEW web address is: www.nsopw.gov. The "old" site address will work for a time yet to be determined.

2009 Google Marketing Challenge

ACA, in collaboration with the School of Business at the University of Indianapolis, is looking for approximately 10 camps to participate in the 2009 Google Online Marketing Challenge. Each camp participating in the Challenge will be involved in a project that will attempt to increase the camp's visibility on the internet, using Search Engine Optimization.

This is the second year of the world-wide challenge that allows students to learn the fundamentals of search engine optimization using the Google AdWords on-line advertising product. There is no cost to participate in the challenge and there will be no changes made to your camp Web site. Rather, student teams will simply use a budget of \$200 provided by Google (per each Web site) to maximize the site's visibility in on-line searches during the three week contest. The only requirement is that the camp CANNOT be a current user of Google AdWords. In addition, a representative of the camp must be available to provide background marketing information to the student teams on a timely basis; this can be accomplished via email exchanges.

The project will begin in early January and run through April. All participating camps will receive a follow-up report with information indicating the search words used, marketing strategy, the budget, and the results. Camps are free to use the strategy themselves, though there is no obligation to use Google AdWords once the contest is over.

Participants will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis, with final selections made by the project professors.

Again, there is no risk to your camp for participating. Participation does guarantee that your camp will benefit from the added exposure of \$200 worth of Google AdWords advertising.

National Fish and Wildlife Foundation: Five-Star Restoration Matching Grants Program

The Five-Star Restoration Matching Grants Program, an initiative of the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, seeks to develop community capacity to sustain local natural resources for future generations by supporting wetland, riparian, and coastal habitat restoration projects. Grants ranging from \$10,000 to \$40,000 are provided to projects that build diverse partnerships and foster natural resource stewardship through education, outreach, and training activities. Partnerships should include at least five organizations that contribute to project success through funding, land, workforce support, technical support, and/or other in-kind services. Projects that can leverage the amount of funds requested with significant cash or in-kind contributions from projects partners are given priority. The application deadline is February 16, 2009.

Health & Wellness: Camp Injury and Illness Data

Year three of the five-year Healthy Camp Study—funded by Markel Insurance—is now completed and analysis of the injury and illness data from almost two hundred camps across the US has begun. Young Community volunteers Invited to Apply for Do Something Awards; Deadline: March 1, 2009

The Do Something Awards, formerly the Brick Awards, are designed to provide recognition and funding for young community volunteers. Do Something Award Winners receive a community grant, participation in the special award ceremony, media coverage, and continued support from Do Something.

In the 2009 program, five winners will receive a minimum of \$10,000 in community grants and scholarships. (Only winners 18 and under are eligible for a scholarship of \$5,000 and a \$5,000 community grant; winners between the ages of 19 and 25 will receive their entire award in the form of a community grant. Of the five winners, one will be selected as a grand-prize winner and will receive a total of \$100,000 in community grants, paid directly to the nonprofit of this or her choice.
