Accreditation Standards Address All Aspects of Camp Management and Operation

Site – Fire protection, food service, sleeping quarters, bathing and toilet facilities

Transportation – Procedures concerning drivers, vehicles, and traffic on site

Health and Wellness – Staff qualifications, facilities requirements, record keeping, storage and distribution of medicines, contact information, health forms

Operational Management – Safety regulations, emergency communications systems, procedures for intruders, personal property regulations

Human Resources – Staff qualifications, hiring, training, supervision ratios, and procedures

Program – Aquatics, adventure/challenge, trips, horseback riding, staff qualifications for special programs
