Red? Green? Christmas? What?

Much of New Mexico's food culture revolves around our official state question, "Red or Green?" The question refers to Red or Green Chile, two variations of the same plant with very different flavors. Green Chile is immature, picked early in the harvest season, roasted and made into a sauce or served chopped. The flavor of the Green Chile has been described as pungent, crisp and spicy with subtle sweet tones. Red Chile is simply a Green Chile that has been allowed to ripen before being harvested. The Red Chile is dried and ground and rehydrated into a sauce with various spices. Red Chile has a lot of the same flavor profile as Green, but the aging adds earthy tones and smokiness with a more mellow front heat and a more aggressive back heat. Both vary on their level of spice heat, and it is rarely consistent, with both Red and Green ranging from mild to extra hot. Not sure which to chose? Order Christmas, and get both. Is this your first time trying New Mexico Chile or not sure about the heat? Order it on the side! But watch out, it is addictive, and oh so delicious!

Areas of Interest

Sandia Peak Aerial Tramway – The longest tramway in the world, the Sandia Peak Aerial Tramway ascends 2.7 miles to the 10,378 foot peak of the Sandia Mountains. Activities include hiking, rock climbing, mountain biking and skiing. 30 Tramway Road NE, 505-856-7325, sandiapeak.com.

National Hispanic Cultural Center - "A world-class center for Hispanic arts and culture, featuring an art museum, a state-of-the-art performing arts complex, a library and genealogy center, a restaurant and a gift shop." 1701 Fourth St SW, 505-246-2261, nhccnm.org.

Indian Pueblo Cultural Center – Explore Pueblo Indian Culture with art and pottery exhibits, Native American dances honoring Mother Earth, and artists selling handmade crafts and jewelry. ABQ Biopark – The Biopark is home to four different attractions; Albuquerque Aquarium, Rio Grande Botanic Garden, Rio Grande Zoo and Tingley Beach.
