**Statement of Compliance:** On an annual basis, all accredited camps are required to have a Statement of Compliance on file at the ACA National office. This statement should be read and signed by either the camp liaison OR another ACA member affiliated with the camp that is familiar with the Accreditation Standards. This statement can be accessed on the website at: [www.ACACamps.org/soc](http://www.ACACamps.org/soc). As always, please contact the Section office with questions or for assistance!

**Do be done yearly:** Below is a list of just a few of the accreditation standards that have to be updated on a yearly basis:

- water testing
- fire equipment evaluation
- driver skill evaluation
- incident analysis.
