



1. What is neffy and who can use it?

neffy is a needle-free nasal spray used for the emergency treatment of allergic reactions, including anaphylaxis. It is approved for adults and children aged 4 years and older who weigh at least 33 pounds.

2. What is the dosing for neffy?

- 1 mg dose for children weighing 33 to 66 pounds
- o 2 mg dose for individuals weighing 66 pounds or more

Each prescription pack contains two nasal sprays. No trainer device is included.

3. Why is neffy more expensive than other epinephrine auto-injectors? While neffy may have a higher upfront cost compared to other epinephrine auto-injectors, its longer shelf life results in a lower cost per season.

Traditional auto-injectors typically expire after just one camp season, whereas neffy offers an extended shelf life lasting multiple summers:

2 mg: 30 months1 mg: 24 months

4. How should neffy be stored?

Store at room temperature between 68°F and 77°F, and avoid freezing. neffy is more stable at higher temperatures than epinephrine in auto-injectors, and can tolerate high temperatures up to 122°F for a few days if necessary.
