# <u>Psychotropic Medications - Resource for Camps</u> 2016

### **Antidepressants**

These medications are most commonly used to treat depression, but some can also be used for anxiety, pain, and insomnia.

# **Anti-Anxiety**

These medications are used to reduce symptoms of anxiety, including panic attacks, or extreme fears or worry.

## **Stimulants**

These medications stimulate alertness, attention, and energy. Some may also elevate blood pressure, heart rate, and respiration rate. Some of these medications are used to treat ADD/ADHD.

## **Antipsychotics**

These medications are primarily used to treat psychosis (conditions that affect the mind and in which there has been some loss of contact with reality). These individuals may have delusions or hallucinations. Physical disorders treated include schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, or severe depression (psychotic depression).

### **Mood Stabilizers**

These medications are primarily used to treat bipolar disorder and mood swings. Some may also be used to address depression, impulse control, and other mental illnesses.
