Keynote Presentation John Hamilton Camp: Trauma, Hope, and a Path to Healing

The Camp HOPE America program focuses on creating collaborative, peer-nurturing, hope and healingcentered pathways for kids facing adversity. However, statistics show adverse experiences impact us all. Camp HOPE America's National Director will share the power and importance of trauma-informed care in a camp setting for all camps – not just specialized camping programs. 64% of Americans have experienced at least one Adverse Childhood Experience, and ACA reaches 10.3 million campers. This means at least 6.5 million campers under ACA's care have experienced one or more forms of trauma. Without intervention, these youth are more likely to experience negative health and behavioral outcomes. In this session, you will gain foundational knowledge of what trauma-informed care in a camp setting means, and how it unfolds practically.
