

Reviewing Your Practices — Improving Your Program

This tool is designed to help you look at the professional practices that are part of your current program and determine if goals need to be set or revised to improve camp operations, procedures, and/or programs. Please answer each question to the best of your ability.

Does your program operate under all applicable local, state, and federal laws, regulations, and codes? (If you are unsure about laws that apply to you, please visit www.ACAcamps.org/publicpolicy/regulations .)
Have you obtained all required permits and licenses to operate? These might include a permit to operate camp, a business license, a permit to occupy a space, building permits, or permits to use public lands. (In some states, these permits are issued by the state's Department of Health. Visit www.ACAcamps.org/publicpolicy/regulations .
Do you conduct background checks for all staff and volunteers that work with your programs? Do you require and check at least two character references for all staff and volunteers that work with your programs? (Additional information on background checks can be found at www.ACAcamps.org/publicpolicy/position-statements .)
Are staff with current first aid and age-appropriate CPR/AED certification available on site at all times when participants are present? (For more information, visit www.ACAcamps.org/accreditation/firstaidcpr .)
Do you have emergency contact information for all participants and staff members?
