Planning Phase

- Board sets strategic direction
- Board Task Group crafts research question and issues request for proposals
- 3. Volunteer Research Advisory Committee selects University of Utah
- ACA builds internal and external support and collaboration opportunities

Exploratory Phase

- 1. 20 ACA-accredited camps selected randomly and proportionate to the ACA-accredited population.
- 2.100 new staff from those camps participate in interviews about their childhood camp experiences and the impacts of camp on school, work, and life, and the camp practices that contributed to those gains

Mapping Phase

- 1. Sample expanded to 40 camps
- 2. Themes from Exploratory Phase used to design survey of camp experiences and the specific camp practices that produces camper outcomes
- 3. 200-300 new staff complete survey about their childhood camp experiences, resulting in a map of unique camp outcomes and camp practices that produce those outcomes

Multi-Year Phase

- 1. Sample expanded to 50 camps
- 2. 10 campers and their families from each camp volunteer to participate in surveys and interviews for
- Families receive \$100 per year + bonus
- 4. Provides first-ever multiyear evidence of camper growth in and outside of
